Plans get underway for Ireland's *real* alternative summer festival

IF the Electric Picnic is as alternative as you thought it gets, think again.

Except instead of a lot of muck stomping to the year's hottest and trendiest acts Ireland's *real* alternative summer festival offers answers to some of the oldest questions in the book. Why are we here? What's it all about? Is God real? Does he really love me? And can I really be happy?

And one of Ireland's leading young songwriters and music producers, *You're a Star* guru Ronan Johnson, has thrown his weight behind it.

Organisers of the National Summer Youth Festival at Knock Shrine are hoping more than 1,000 young people aged between 18 and 35 will camp-up and flock to Knock Shrine between July 24 and 27 to celebrate Catholicism and faith in modern Ireland under the banner 'Living Life to the Full?'

And just to make sure prospective festival goers aren't put off with traditional dusty prayer books, and the idea that faith and church are dated and out of touch, this festival will blow that idea away. The festival is about creating a space to really experience the relevance of Christ in our crazy, busy and noisy lives and that can transform our lives.

Ronan Johnson or Rojo, whose recent works includes musically producing the latest UTV hit programme *Rock Rivals*, will deliver the keynote talk on the opening evening, speaking about the influence of religion and faith in his life.

According to youth ministry director at the shrine, Ms. Ann Lee, young people in Ireland desperately need to tune out of the crazy 'noise' of modern life, which constantly surrounds them and distracts attention from what is really important in life.

"Our lives can be so swamped with the noise and pace of modern life," she explained.

"It's difficult to find time and space to tune out of our iPod's, mobile phones, computer or whatever, and just tune into ourselves.

"With all of the constant noise and busyness, around us, we can be deaf to our needs, desires, our hurts, and our joys.

"This festival is about helping people get back in touch with what is really important in life. Are they happy? Or are their lives full to the point of bursting but really just empty at the heart of it.

"That's why we called this year's festival 'Living life to the full?'"

Leading theologian, Fr. Michael Paul Gallagher SJ, will provide a powerful workshop about our deepest desires and their fulfilment, faith and unbelief, culture and spirituality.

Other highlights of the festival weekend include a concert by the band Elation, a candlelight reconciliation and healing service.

The youth festival event has been a growing success since it was first held in 2002 with the largest turnout to date last year of more than 1,000 young people from all over the country and beyond.

"Working with people like Fr. Michael Paul Gallagher SJ, Ronan Johnston, Dr. Andrew O'Connell, Fr. Benny Mc Hale and many others, we are providing a programme that enables young people to realise their desires and needs and to facilitate a powerful encounter with Christ in that place."
