- 4. Celebrate God's forgiveness in confession early in Lent, and let your Lent be a living out of your new start in life.
- 5. In television and reading, choose what will feed your mind and heart.
- 6. In your Bible, read a little of the Gospel each day, prayerfully.
- 7. Take time each day for prayer—preferably not when you are tired.
- 8. Pay a short visit to a church every day or every week—either a special visit or when passing.
- 9. Is there someone who would benefit from you bringing them to Mass on Sunday or weekday?
- 10. Keep Sunday free of work and shopping that does not really need to be done on Sunday. Keep it for family, for visiting the sick, etc.
- 11. Do something each day to give someone joy, without being asked.
- 12. Each week visit someone who is sick or bereaved or lonely
