Why Celebrate Easter?

The Easter Triduum (3 days) is the heart of the Church's year. It begins on the evening of Holy Thursday and ends on Easter

Sunday. The forty days of Lent prepare for it—the fifty days after Easter continue its celebration. The Easter Triduum is the greatest feast of all because it is the annual celebration of the Lord's death and resurrection. It is really worth celebrating because it was mainly by his death and resurrection that Christ redeemed us and gave perfect glory to God.

So, you are invited to join us in celebrating the **Mass of the Last Supper** on Thursday; the **Liturgy of the Passion** on Friday and especially the **Easter Vigil** on Holy Saturday night which is the climax of the whole three days.
