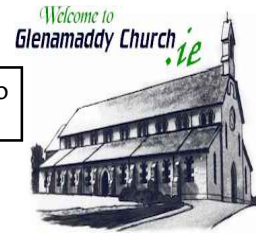

VOLUNTEERS needed on Thursday next at 8pm to give a 'spring clean' for the reopening of our church to a congregation for Mass. The cobwebs and dust have found their way in! If you can help out that would be great.

BOOKING NUMBER for attending Mass in church is (086) 2045896 strictly between the hours of 10am-12 noon on Monday only. The Government has restricted the numbers to 50 people. Those attending Mass in the church are asked to park in the Community School or Convent Car Park only. Please do not park in the Church Car Park as we need to free up this area for those who wish to receive Holy Communion in their cars. Our community is invited to come join us in your cars and park outside the church. We have new speakers installed and you will be able to hear the Mass and receive Holy Communion. You can also tune into local radio at 106.4fm.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays since the beginning of restrictions will remain removed.

It is most important that people who are vulnerable or unwell, and especially those with any symptoms that might suggest Covid-19 infection, should stay at home and listen in on local radio.

On entering the church you should sanitise your hands and it is now compulsory to wear a mask. Please have your mask removed when the Minister of the Eucharist will be distributing Holy Communion.

You will need to take guidance from ushers, this will require patience and understanding from all concerned.

Church doors will open 30 minutes before commencement of Mass. You may not be able to sit in your usual favourite seat.

Communion will be brought to you in your seat in the Church.

Those parking on the street will form a queue (2 metre social distance) from the main door and Holy Communion will be distributed there.

Toilets will remain closed. Altar Servers will be introduced at a later stage.

Those from surrounding parishes to attend Mass at their local church.

Strictly no entry to the sanctuary or sacristy areas at any time.

Midweek Masses this week will continue to be celebrated during the week behind closed doors.

Sunday collection envelopes can be dropped in the black box on entering the church for those attending Mass inside the church. For those in the car park they can be given to the stewards at the exit.

It is also recommended that people do not congregate outside Church for a chat
