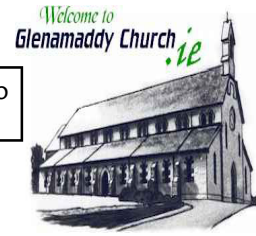

GLOBAL FORGIVENESS DAY

Wednesday 7th July. A day to forgive and be forgiven, Forgiveness Day is a chance to set things right. It is the perfect opportunity to set aside old differences, move beyond grievances or hurts, and start afresh. In fact, some health studies have shown that people who are willing to offer forgiveness, whether to themselves or others, are much more likely to be happy and healthy than those who withhold forgiveness! That's a great reason to live a life centered around forgiveness. Although this can certainly happen on any day and doesn't need to wait for a special day, Global Forgiveness Day can act as a kickstart or motivator to really make it happen! Maybe it would work as a good conversation starter for getting the ball rolling with that friend or family member who needs to be forgiven. Some people get many decades into their lives before they learn how important it is to forgive. Children can be spared a great deal of pain by being taught the skill of forgiveness at a very young age. For older kids, have a discussion about the health and freedom that can be found in forgiveness. Forgiveness is part of the process of healing and not holding resentment any longer, even if the people being forgiven are not aware of it or have already died.
