

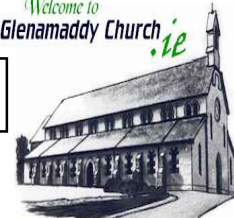

Our Sister, Mother Earth: Popes, on occasion, write letters to Christians across the world. These letters are known as Papal Encyclicals. Pope Francis wrote a very powerful Encyclical Letter, titled *Laudato Si'*: On the Care of our Common Home in July 2019.
