


THE SYNODAL ASSEMBLY The Church in Ireland and across the world is preparing for the Synod Assembly. Pope Francis launched a two-year global consultation in the Vatican on the 10th October 2021. The pope asks that parishes and dioceses across the world discuss their experience of their faith and their Church and to provide feedback to the Synod Assembly. What can we do to further the Synod? Pope Francis asks that, within the parish, we listen to one another and build understanding with all our sisters and brothers. Each person has something to teach us when we listen to them respectfully. Pope Francis explains that all the baptized must take responsibility for the future of the Church and the passing on of the Christian message. Together, we seek to discover, through prayer and reflection, what God wants of his Church at this time. How can parish communities flourish without the leadership of a priest?
